


### <u>Autumn 1- School Trip-Friday 26th September 2025</u>



This term the pupils will visit Bradford Industrial Museum-Pupils will get to explore the museum and will attend 'Let's Explore Transport' workshop. This ties in with our history topic. I will send further details out this week.

English - Core text - What the Lady Bird Heard Pupils will learn how to re-tell a story with a beginning, middle and an end. Pupils will focus on capital letters, finger spaces and full stops to create simple sentences.



<u>Science</u>-Our Body-Pupils will learn about the body and the five senses; sight, hearing, touch, smell, and taste.

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### Religious Education

Pupils will answer the question 'What do Christians believe God is like?' Pupils will read the parable 'The lost son' and 'The story of Jonah'. They will discuss the hidden meanings in the story and what they teach us.





#### <u>History</u>

This term the children will learn about how transport has changed from the Victorian era to present day. They will also learn about the lives of significant individuals from the past who have contributed to national and international achievements - The first aeroplane flight -

This term, the children will begin by exploring numeral formation and developing a solid understanding of place value within 20. They will also dive into geometry, identifying and describing both 2D and 3D shapes through hands-on activities and visual learning.
